

Math Placement FAQ for Current Students

- 1) How do I improve my score?
 - a. The best way to improve on a person's score is to attend a review session. Review sessions are held daily in the Academic Success Center during the Fall and Spring Semesters and by appointment at other times of the year. The schedule can be found in the Academic Success Center or on the Math Placement Review website (mathplacement.strose.edu).
- 2) I can't make it to the review sessions. What else can I do?
 - a. There are still several options for you. One is to work with some of the Math tutors in the Open Lab. To find the schedule for Math tutoring, you can find it on the Academic Success Center website, or at the Academic Success Center. You can also do review with the review videos and worksheets found on the Math Placement Review website.
- 3) I've taken the Math Placement Test three times and still can't get my score. What do I do now?
 - a. By policy, if a student has taken the Math Placement Test three times and still does not have a sufficient score, that student **must come in to Academic Success to do review**. If you can't make any of the review sessions or Open Lab sessions, please contact Matthew Woods (woodsm@strose.edu) and see what arrangements can be made.
- 4) When can I retake the Math Placement Test?
 - a. To retake the Math Placement Test, contact the Academic Success Center at 518-454-5299 or mathplacement@strose.edu to see what appointments are available.
- 5) When should I complete the Math Placement Test requirement for my major?
 - a. A student in Math or Science should have their requirement done ASAP, at the latest by the end of their first semester at Saint Rose. A student in the School of Business should have it done no later than the end of their first year. A student in any other major should have it done by the end of their second year. While these times are not mandatory deadlines, they serve as a good guideline for students to remain on track for four-year graduation.
